#### **Picture This!**

Fifteen Year 9 girls have participated in a 4 week project called Picture This!

# **Oxford University**

Ten students visited Oxford University. What a fantastic opportunity for the students. A tour of student halls, lunch and three mini lectures gave the students a real insight into student life at Oxford University. A trip in the summer term is planned for selected students in Years 7,8 & 9.



The internet is a great place for education, creativity and entertainment, but we know our young people need the right skills to navigate the web and stay safe online. Statistics show that teenagers are spending increased hours in front of a screen every day and research shows that more than one in three British 15-year-olds are "extreme internet users" who spend at least six hours a day online. By the age of 14 the average child will have sent more than 35,000 texts, 30,000 WhatsApp messages and racked up more than three solid weeks of video chat.

British children also start going online for the first time at a young age, nearly a third (27.6%) of young people in the UK were six years old or younger when they first used the internet.

Children and young people actively engage with social media and we need to support them to understand the risks of how they behave online, and be empowered to make sense of and know how to respond to harmful content which they may come across.

At Smith's Wood Academy, we have been working with the Diana Award and our Anti Bullying Ambassador team to look at our students online habits. Following a regional 'Be Strong Online' Training Day the team conducted a survey to attempt to identify areas where we could provide more information, advice and guidance to help our young people become more digitally resilient.

The results are in and our research highlighted a number of areas the team would like to address. The team, headed up by our Be Strong Online Ambassador Zara Benfarhat, are busy creating workshops which will be delivered to all students across the Academy in the Summer Term including activities on selfies and self esteem, digital detox, digital footprint, cyber buylling and peer pressure online.

- We would much rather encourage and reward students for good attendance. However, please do be aware that when these incentives fail to improve attendance then we will begin to take legal action. This is not a step we wish to take but will do so if necessary; unfortunately, the outcomes can be quite severe. For example, a recent Birmingham court outcome (9.2.18) was as follows: Parent failed to attend court and a fine was issued Band B £293.00. Court costs £600.00 plus victim surcharge £30.00 totalling £923.00 with 28 days (collection order) to pay. Children need to be in school to succeed. Please support us in supporting your child to achieve well and be happy at school.
