#### Term time holidays

Recently, the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 amended Regulation 7 of the 2006 Regulations to prohibit the Head of Academy to grant leave of absence to a pupil except where an application has been made in advance and the Head considers that there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. This means if the Head deems the leave applied for can reasonably be taken outside of term time, the request for leave of absence will not be authorised.

If the Head of Academy does not grant the leave of absence request but parents/guardians still decide to go ahead, absence will be marked as unauthorised. Unauthorised absences may be referred to Solihull Local Authority and result in a Penalty Notice payable up to £120 fine for failure to comply with the law. Section 444 of the Education Act 1996 states that: If a child of compulsory school age, who is a registered pupil at a school, fails to attend regularly at the school his/her parent(s) are guilty of an offence.

Smith's Wood Academy will consider all applications for leave of absence requests but must comply with the current stipulations of granting leave in exceptional circumstances only.

#### \*\*\*\*\*\* IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION \*\*\*\*\*\*

We have received notification from an Independent Travel Trainer, working for Solihull MBC, that a number of our pupils have been witnessed throwing water bottles (full of water) into the road, outside the X12 bus stop on Windward Way. This appears to be a game where the bottle is thrown prior to a car passing by. The goal is for the car to run it over and crush the bottle. If this is not successful then the game is repeated. Several cars have been seen to swerve the bottles.
