Message from the Head of Academy

I would like to begin by thanking all of our students and staff that worked so well together last week to make the Sport Relief fundraising week the excellent event that it was. It always impresses me how much our children care about other people; this is what makes them special. Here, Year 11 students Lucy Male and Lucy Hancock summarise their experiences of this event (and also practise their article writing skills for their forthcoming GCSE English!):

To Raise or Not to Raise?

'Imagine you are wheelchair bound. Imagine you cannot leave the house on your own.

Imagine you are not able to walk at all. This is where Sport Relief funds can help.

On the 23rd of March SWA students and staff came in non-uniform (jeans and sportswear) to raise money for Sport Relief. Students contributed 50 pence towards this valuable cause. Every single penny raised will have a positive impact on someone's life; every single penny will be used to aid people who need help; every single penny will be converted into a pound.

Last year Sport relief raised over 50 million pounds. This is phenomenal! Wow! Smith's Wood Academy is thrilled to be a part of the community that helps vulnerable people, across the UK and the world, to live happier, healthier and safer lives.

In addition, a badminton tournament was organised where students and staff alike competed for the first place. Well done to Kirsty Pyle and Mr Hart, our reigning champions!

I would also like to thank those parents that attended Parents' Forum this week. We worked collaboratively together to begin to shape our behaviour policy for the next academic year; your input was very much valued – thank you.

SOLIHULL SCHOOLS PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION

Earlier this term Smith's Wood Academy was invited to take part in the fourth annual Solihull Schools Public Speaking Competition that was held in Solihull Council House. This is a very prestigious competition that aims to encourage young people to play a more prominent part in public life by having the experience of speaking on a public platform.

Smith's Wood had four candidates. Each of the strong candidates were able to formulate ideas on topical subjects and deliver their inspiring speeches to other students and a panel of judges. Serena Bobozo-Tshibaka, Clara Ingram, Sophia Essex and Charlotte Griffin (who represented SWA last year) expressed their keen interest to take part in this event and Serena and Sophia were chosen to advance to the semi-finals.

Here, Serena (year 9) summarises her experiences of the event:

Whilst preparing for my speech I gained a lot of confidence and I managed to express what I feel and know about the issue of immigration. Working on this project, I have definitely improved my speaking skills which I know will be useful for my GCSE. I would also encourage other students to play a more prominent part in the Academy by participating in different types of competition on offer.

Serena delivered her powerful speech on immigration in the UK. This is an issue that many people would shy away from, yet Serena was skillful enough to create a speech that held the attention of not only the judges, but the contestants themselves. Her personality shone through her speech: she regarded this difficult issue with tact and care. Serena's delivery was calm and compelling, despite that fact that she was competing against older candidates.

SWA is very proud of the girls' achievements and have faith that next year we will be the winners.

- We would much rather encourage and reward students for good attendance. However, please do be aware that when these incentives fail to improve attendance then we will begin to take legal action. This is not a step we wish to take but will do so if necessary; unfortunately, the outcomes can be quite severe. For example, a recent Birmingham court outcome (9.2.18) was as follows: Parent failed to attend court and a fine was issued Band B £293.00. Court costs £600.00 plus victim surcharge £30.00 totalling £923.00 with 28 days (collection order) to pay. Children need to be in school to succeed. Please support us in supporting your child to achieve well and be happy at school.
- Please find below a summary of outcomes from attendance cases that were taken to the Magistrates Court on 16th March:

<u>Case 1</u>: the defendant failed to attend court. Case proved in their absence. Total fine £600 to be paid in full within 28 days.

Case 2: defendant given credit for guilty plea. Total fine £425

<u>Case 3</u>: the defendant failed to attend court. Case proved in their absence. Total fine £600, to be paid in full within 28 days.

<u>Case 4</u>: the defendant failed to attend court. Case proved in their absence. Total fine £600, to be paid in full within 28 days. X2 children total £1200.

<u>Case 5</u>: the defendant failed to attend court. Case proved in their absence. Total fine £600, to be paid in full within 28 days.
