- Continents = A great land mass (area of land); there are seven continents. The UK is in Europe
- Ocean = A large expanse (area) of sea
- **Urban-** A built up area (town or city)
- Rural An area that is mainly countryside, but may have villages and small towns.
- Longitude imaginary lines that run north to south on the globe
- **Latitude** imaginary lines that run east to west on the globe
- **UK** = United Kingdom of Great Britain & Northern Ireland.
- **Vegetation** = trees, plants and natural greenery
- Dense population (High density) = lots of people living in an area
- Sparse population (Low density) few people living in an area
- OS map = Ordnance Survey map. This is a map created by the official map agency of the UK
- **Contour line** = a line on a map that shows the height of the land
