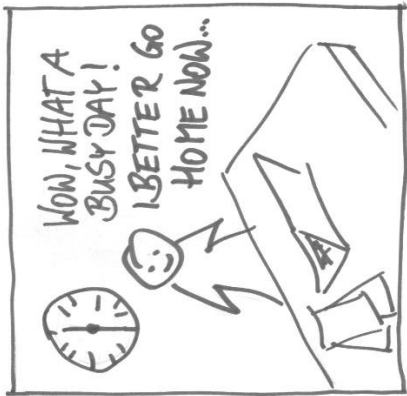

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a storyboard about a topic of your choice. This could be any topic from your school work. You could also choose a topic which interests you, and that you know about. For example a holiday, a book or film, a journey (real or from your imagination), an event in history, a recipe. • A storyboard should follow a few simple rules: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Use at least six, and no more than twelve boxes. 2. Each box should show a different moment, or place. 3. Each box should include a simple image and a short sentence. 4. There should be a beginning, and end to the story. • The example on the next page about cooking a meal shows each of the rules used well.
Where do you complete the work?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On paper, or digitally using Word, Publisher or PowerPoint. There are also some free mind map apps available in your smartphone's store.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a mind map about a topic of your choice. This could be any topic from your school work. You could also choose a topic which interests you, and that you know about. For example a hobby, a celebrity, a film franchise, a restaurant chain, a holiday. • A mind map should follow a few simple rules: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Use a mix of images and text. 6. Use different colours for each part of a topic. 7. Write on, or in the lines that you make. 8. Lines should get thinner as you move away from the middle. 9. There should be a simple image in the middle. • The example on the next page about tennis shows each of the rules used well.
