<p>Complete Performing characters – physical skills for interpreting a character on the following link https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/guides/zd2vhbk/revision/1</p> <p>Once you have completed the unit complete the following questions.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) How might an actor play Mrs Johnson express her grief at the end of the play? 2) Explain how an actor might use performance skills to show that Mrs Lyons is more powerful than Mrs Johnstone in Act One. 3) How might an actor playing Mickey use performance skills to show that he is a child? 4) How does Linda change as she gets older? Explain how an actor might reflect this in their performance. 5) How might an actor playing Sammy show that he is out of control in Act Two? 6) Choose a moment from the play where the Narrator can't be seen by the other characters on stage. Explain how an actor playing the Narrator might interact with those characters. 7) Choose one character from Blood Brothers and choose one scene in which that character appears. Explain two ways you could use physical skills to play the character in this scene. (4 Marks) Remember to give two examples of what you would do and explain why. 8) Choose one character from Blood Brothers and one scene in which that character appears. As a performer, give three suggestions of how you would use performance skills to convey your chosen character's intentions to an audience in this extract. You must provide a reason for each suggestion. (6 marks)
