LATENESS = LOST LEARNING

It is important that students are punctual so that they do not miss the beginning of each school day.

The Academy is open from **8:25am** for Year groups: 7, 8 and 10 students to be on site and **8.40am** for Year groups 9 and 11.

Where a student arrives after the register closes at 9:30am this will be classed as an unauthorised late (code U as per Department of Education compulsory attendance codes) and affects overall attendance.

The registers are monitored daily to identify students who are arriving late and regular late arrival for school will be challenged as unacceptable. Students who have 10 or more U codes will be referred to the Education Enforcement Team for possible legal action (including a Penalty Notice).

Missed days over the school year reduces your child's chances of success.

Your child will be missing learning opportunities if they are not in school or are late to school.

Please work with us to give your child the best chances of success by ensuring that they are in school, every day, on time.

Attendance Matters

Before all schools re-opened in September, Department for Education issued a full document (Guidance for full opening of schools) setting out measures and providing a framework for school leaders to put in place proportionate protective measures for children and staff, which also ensure that all students receive a high-quality education that enables them to thrive and progress. It's been recognised that returning to school is vital for children's education and for their wellbeing. Time out of school is detrimental for children's cognitive and academic development.

Attendance expectations set out in the guidelines

In March, when the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic was increasing, it was made clear no parent would be penalised or sanctioned for their child's non-attendance at school.

Now the circumstances have changed, it is vital for all children to return to school to minimise, as far as possible, the longer-term impact of the pandemic on children's education, wellbeing and wider development. Missing out on more time in the classroom risks students falling further behind. Those with higher overall absence tend to achieve less well in both primary and secondary school.

School attendance has been therefore mandatory again from the beginning of this autumn term. This means, the usual rules on school attendance apply, including:

- parents' duty to secure that their child attends regularly at school where the child is a registered pupil at school and they are of compulsory school age
- schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence
- the availability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct

Shielding advice for all adults and children paused on 1 August 2020. This means that even the small number of students who will remain on the shielded patient list can return to school, as can those who have family members who are shielding.

What sanctions can be put in place for non-attendance?

If a registered pupil of compulsory school age fails to attend school regularly, the parent could be guilty of an offence under <u>section 444 Education Act 1996</u>. In April 2017, the Supreme Court held that attending school "regularly" means attendance in accordance with the rules prescribed by the school and not "sufficiently frequent attendance". This means that a child must attend school on every day that the school requires him or her to do so and failure to do this may lead to the commission of an offence.

Rewards 2020-21

The rewards programme at Smith's Wood Academy is now back up and running. Below are just some of the rewards that are an offer throughout the year and how students can be recognised for their achievements whilst attending Smith's Wood Academy.

Carrots Rewards

Carrots rewards are a way of recognising students within lessons through s sticker-based reward programme. Students receive stickers with a unique code on them and log them via their my-stickers account which can be found via www.mystickers.co.uk and all students should have their own individual log in details to register their rewards. The more stickers students achieve the higher the rewards they gain.

To date SWA has handed out over 18,012 Merit stickers to over 567 students in years 7-11 across a range of subjects. Currently 229 students have achieved the first Milestone reward of 25 Merits, 101 students have achieved their second reward having surpassed 50 Merits, 37 students have achieved their third reward for surpassing 75 Merits, 13 students have reached 100 Merits and 6 students have reached 125 Merits.

There will be a Carrots rewards trip (venue and date TBC) for all those students, who have received 100 Merits or more. This is in recognition of the hard work they have put into lessons to receive such a high volume of rewards. . Students who have 100% attendance for the whole term leading up to Christmas shall be invited to the Theatre for a showing of a film

Attendance

Students who have 100% attendance for this half term will be invited to have cookies and juice in recognition of their excellent attendance. This will take place on Thursday 22nd and Friday 23rd October, invites and information to be sent to students and parents W/B 19th October. Students must have 100% attendance up to the day of their reward.

An end of year rewards trip is being booked to **Drayton Manor Theme park** and **Ice Skating at Planet Ice**. Students who have an attendance of 96% and above for the whole academic year will be invited to these trips and have the option to choose to go on one or the other. The date for the attendance rewards trips are to be confirmed. **This is subject to change depending on government guidelines**.

All students, in all years who obtain 100% attendance for the full Academic year will receive and **Never Been Absent** blazer badge, students will be encouraged to wear this to display their dedication and resilience to attend school and access education at all times.

Along with this there is a Core Values badge for all students who receive zero behaviour points for the year. Again, this is a blazer badge to recognise their commitment to school.

Students who achieve 100% attendance for the half term will also have a letter sent home in the post with an attendance Carrot sticker on it to the value of 10 Merits which when received are to be logged by the students. Again, this is for Years 7-10 only.

Rewards Assemblies

At the end of this half term, each year group will have a celebration assembly with their year groups. This will be led by their respective Excellence Lead and students shall be rewarded for effort and progress within all the lessons they study in their year group. This is a half-termly reward and the next reward assembly will be during the W/B 19th October 2020.

Hot Chocolate with the Head of Academy

Staring last school year, we have introduced a new weekly reward of hot chocolate with the Head of Academy. Each week one pupil from each of the respective years is chosen by the pastoral team to receive this reward. The rewards are given to students demonstrating resilience, progression and determination. This award is due to begin first week after half term and names shall be passed to Mrs Hewson and invites to be sent out accordingly.

Face Coverings In School
