In 2023/24, the ASK programme will continue to offer every educational establishment in England with students in years 10 – 13 access to a free, bespoke support package to transform apprenticeship and vocational education

awareness activities so that students, parents and carers, teachers and careers advisers and governors can be informed about the wonderful opportunities available. The programme will continue to be delivered in a flexible, blended way to meet your needs and will contribute towards the Provider Access Legislation (PAL) requirements as an approved provider of PAL.

Over 2023/24, the programme will also be continuing to ensure that further support is available for FE colleges so that tutors, colleagues and staff can feel confident in supporting their Level 3 students to explore apprenticeship opportunities when finishing college.

With so much progress having been made in students' knowledge and awareness of apprenticeships since the programme launched in 2016, for this academic year, ASK will be prioritising the delivery of sessions that support students to navigate the search and application process for apprenticeships, so that more students are supported to prepare and attain an apprenticeship.

We encourage you to book a planning meeting with our delivery partners to take full advantage of this offer and create a careers support package for your school or college that is truly inspirational.

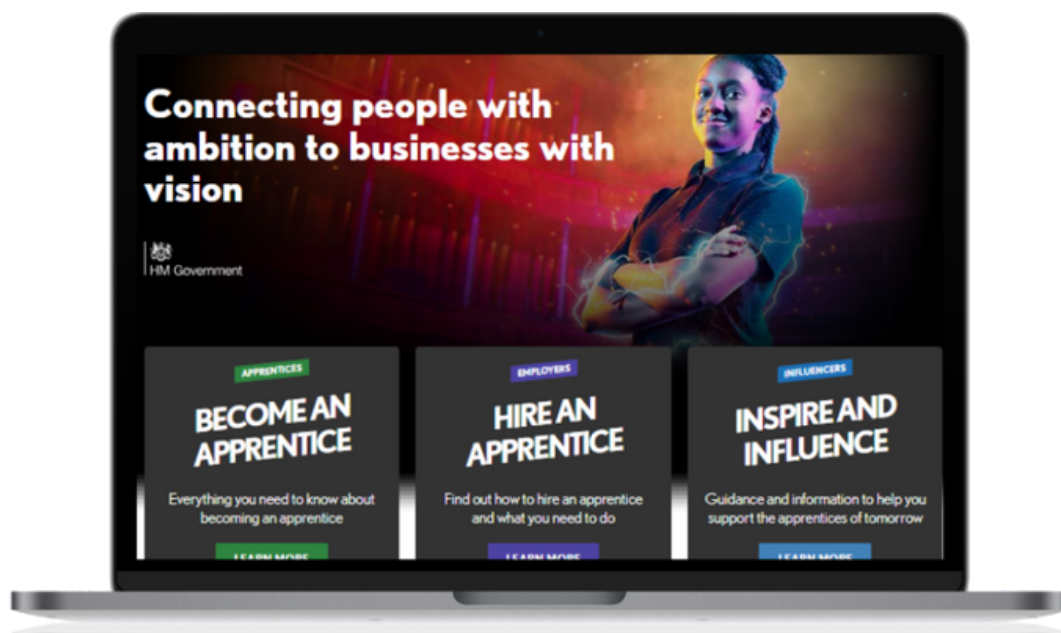

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How the ASK programme works

The ASK programme is fully funded by the Department for Education and offers all educational establishments in England access to support to increase awareness of apprenticeships and T Levels amongst students, parents, carers, teachers and career advisers.

HOW TO ACCESS SUPPORT

1. Browse the support available

Visit our [website](#) or browse this brochure to discover the range of free support available.

2. Submit an online request

Complete a [short online form](#) which will be sent to the ASK team to process.

3. Attend a planning meeting with an ASK delivery partner

Once you have submitted your request, the ASK delivery partner in your area will get in touch to arrange a time for a planning meeting. The delivery partner will discuss your needs and explain the types of support available. The meeting can be carried out virtually or in person.

4. Book your support activities

Working with your delivery partner, book a mixture of support activities that meet the needs of your school or college, students, teachers and parents. All activities are designed to raise awareness of apprenticeships and T Levels.

5. Access the resource hub

6. Book onto the CPD workshops

Types of support

The ASK programme offers a range of free support for schools and colleges which we've outlined below.

Activities and workshops

The activities and workshops delivered through ASK are inspiring sessions that are delivered by local experts (ASK delivery partners), on behalf of the Department for Education.

All activities and workshops are designed to inform and inspire your students, staff and parents about apprenticeships and T Levels. You can read more about them later in this brochure.

Most activities have been designed flexibly so that they can be delivered as a face to face or virtual session, depending on what works best for your school/college.

Some activities can only be delivered in-person and we encourage schools and colleges to book activities as an in-person session wherever possible to increase engagement and overall impact.

Planning your activities

The [ASK programme](#) continually develops to reflect and deliver ministerial priorities and to support the broader direction of the Careers landscape. This is evident in ASK's renewed commitment to working with underrepresented or disadvantaged cohorts, establishments in the levelling up areas and those within our Development School sub-programme.

As a result of this prioritisation, with ASK being a finite resource, we will limit the number of return visits partners can deliver to each establishment this academic year.

We would, therefore, remind establishments of the abundance of resources available online, including the [Amazing Apprenticeships](#) website and the [Government apprenticeships website](#), and encourage you to reach out to your local Careers Hub for additional support.

It may also be useful to consider booking multiple ASK activities on one day to maximise the impact of each visit.

Your ASK delivery partner can work with you to explore and prioritise the activities that may be most suitable and will enhance your existing careers provision through your planning meeting.



THE FE College ASK offer for 2023/24

Working with FE colleges

The [ASK programme](#), now in its 9th year, is fully funded by the Department for Education. The programme has gone from strength to strength, engaging more than 3.5 million students in schools and colleges across England. Whilst this is fantastic, we know that we must continue to innovate the ASK offer to ensure that we are meeting the needs of all young people – and this includes FE Colleges.

Following a review of the support that we offer to FE Colleges conducted in 2022 with 78 FE Colleges, the feedback received highlighted several challenges that FE Colleges were experiencing in accessing the ASK programme, including being able to service the needs of multi-campus colleges, being able to offer support to students across a range of subjects and levels and also the importance of being able to collaborate on the ASK offer, so that duplication can be avoided, meaning the focus of the support can be on the most relevant and impactful activities.

Working with this feedback, we shaped and developed a new and improved FE College offer for the 2022/23 academic year that included multi-campus coverage, which will carry forward into 2023/24.

A collaborative approach

We will work with you to understand and complement your existing provision, and to ensure that we are not duplicating, but enhancing your college careers programme. We will do this by holding a consultation (planning meeting) with you to understand the requirements of your college, including:

- The structure of your college, the number of campus locations, the type and level of courses offered (full time, part time and work based) and learner characteristics.
- The careers education programme offered to students and staff, including support and signposting already in place, careers fairs and local recruitment activities.
- The apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships offered through your college.
- Your baseline data on student destinations and apprenticeship uptake.
- Local partnerships, including Careers Hubs, employers and other stakeholders.

Once the consultation meeting has been completed and we are clear about how the ASK programme could add greatest value and impact for your students, we will be able to plan a bespoke schedule of activity and book the sessions in.

The FE College offer

Examples of the types of workshops and sessions that FE Colleges could access include:

- Apprenticeships explained (a group information and inspiration session)
- Using Find an Apprenticeship
- Career Starter Apprenticeships – jobs of the future
- How to find an apprenticeship
- How to apply for an apprenticeship
- Preparing for the apprenticeship recruitment process

All presentations and workshops can be tailored to include subject-specific information linked to different curriculum areas and levels of learners. Resources can support your college in preparing your students to apply for apprenticeships.

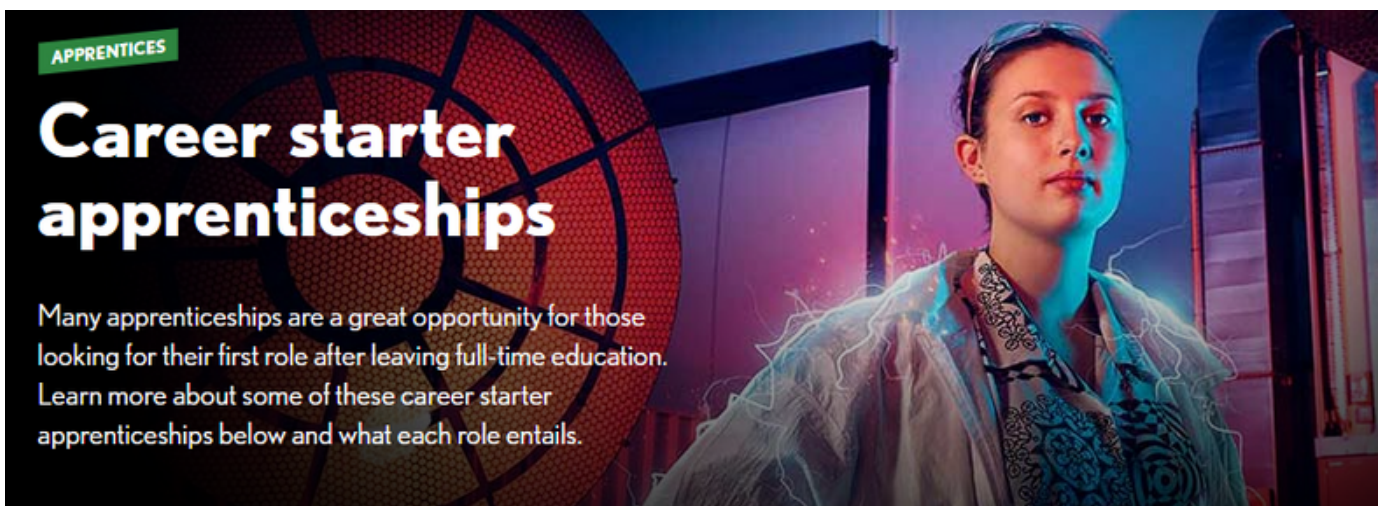
Career starter sessions

Career starter sessions are a great way for students to learn more about different careers available through apprenticeships and how they can access and progress in an exciting sector and role.

Students will also explore what is important to them through a job and begin to identify apprenticeships that may be suitable to them.

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Awareness assemblies are a great way to introduce apprenticeships and other post-16 and post-18 options to your students. They involve expert speakers visiting your school or college (in person or virtually) to present to groups of students and explain the range of career options.

The assemblies can be tailored to meet the needs of your students: whether that be focussing on sustainable Green Apprenticeships or differentiating for a SEND cohort. They provide an overview of the opportunities, the different sectors and levels available, including an introduction to higher and degree apprenticeships.

We also have access to the Apprenticeship Ambassador Network, where apprentice and employer Ambassadors can attend assemblies to share their inspirational stories with students.

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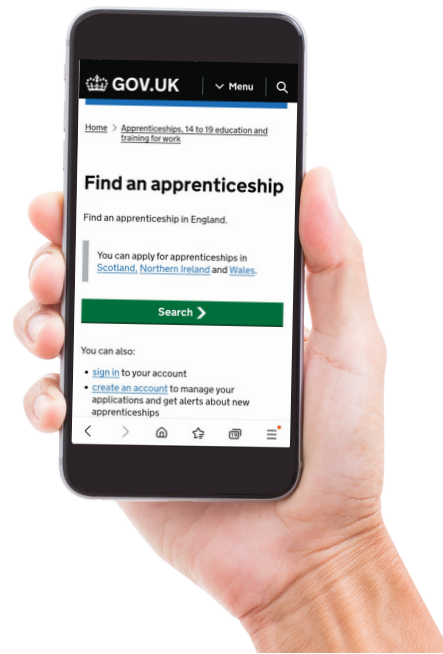
These sessions are best delivered in-person, but can also be delivered virtually.

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The CV and application workshops encourage students to engage in fun and interactive activities which will help them prepare for future apprenticeship applications.

These sessions are best delivered in-person, but they can also be delivered as a live virtual session.

For each session, the ASK team will join you and your students and will help you navigate through the application and CV writing process in more detail.

Sessions will cover:

- recognising strengths and how to showcase them to employers
- how to write successful apprenticeship job applications
- understanding application processes and what they could involve



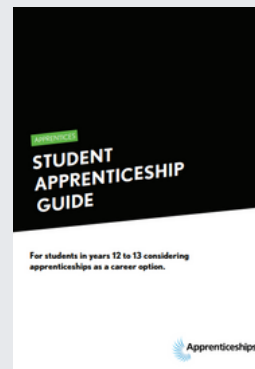
Mock assessment centre workshops

Interactive group exercises which introduce students to assessment centres as a recruitment method and provides students with hints and tips.

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Our ASK delivery partners will join you and your students to deliver group exercises which explore new recruitment methods that they might be expected to participate in during the recruitment process with larger employers.

Workshops can be tailored to the students' level of ability, confidence and areas of interest and are always popular with students.

Mock interview sessions

ASK partners will work with you to put together engaging workshops that provide students with the opportunity to experience what a real interview might be like.

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Sessions can include local business people, where possible, who will help to conduct the interview and provide valuable feedback to each student.

Students are asked to prepare ahead of the mock interview, this includes preparing a CV, researching what may be expected of them, and practising responding to potential interview questions.

Sessions are adapted to the size and experience of the group being supported, as well as the availability of local employers.

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Live presentations

Through the Apprenticeship Ambassador Network (AAN), the ASK programme has access to hundreds of apprentices and employers to share their apprenticeship experience and inspire the apprentices of tomorrow. 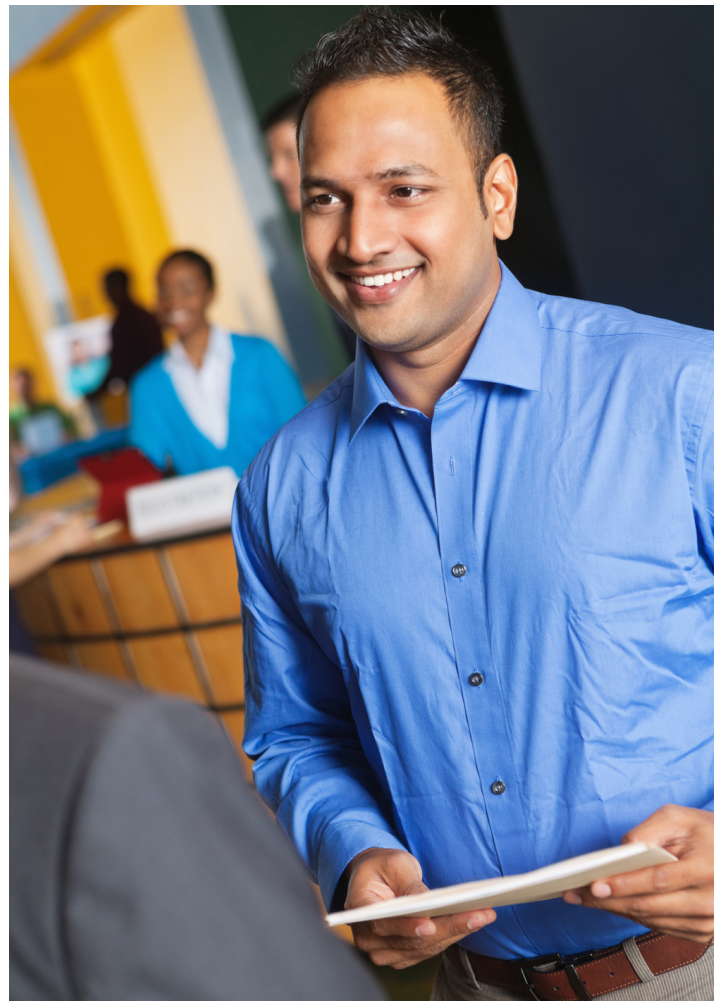

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If you're hosting a careers fair in 2023/24, then you can access additional support through the ASK team. We can join you either in-person or virtually to inform students and their parents or carers about apprenticeships and the benefits. We can also work with local employers and apprenticeship ambassadors to attend and share their experiences and opportunities.

Most schools and colleges ask that we deliver a short presentation about apprenticeships at the start or during their careers fair, but your ASK delivery partner will work with you to work out what works best for your school or college.

Support for careers leaders

The ASK programme can support careers leaders in developing meaningful careers provision for their school or college.

Careers strategy

The government's careers strategy sets out an expectation that every school or college will identify a careers leader. As a consequence, careers leaders are now supported centrally through the Careers and Enterprise Company (a key partner of the ASK programme) and their Careers Hubs.

The ASK programme can help careers leaders plan meaningful careers provision for their school or college that includes information about apprenticeships and T Levels and aligns with the Gatsby Benchmarks.

Working with the Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC)

The ASK programme work with the CEC at a national and local level. The ASK programme is a PAL compliant provider and delivery partners work closely with local Careers Hubs to ensure that they are supporting schools/colleges in the region to offer high quality apprenticeships and T Level CEIAG to all students, colleagues and parents/carers.

The DfE work closely with the national CEC team to review impact and engagement at local levels and provide support nationally to CEC and ASK colleagues in further enhancing provision.

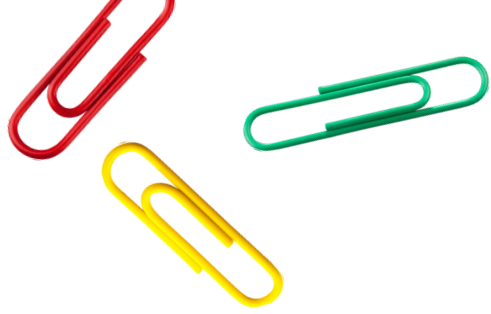
