GCSEs	Vocational Courses
Traditional qualifications	BTEC or Cambridge National
Feature compulsory core subjects Maths, English and Science	Specialist work-related qualifications which aim to help you learn about a specific industry or area of work
Build on existing knowledge which has been learned in earlier Key Stages	They are divided into units, which cover specific areas of knowledge, skills, and understanding
They are assessed mainly through written exams which take place during May/June of Y11. Some subjects may have practical exams and/or coursework.	They are assessed by both exams, coursework and/or practical assessments
Level 2 qualifications - Grade 9-1	They are level 2 qualifications and are equivalent to GCSEs although have a different grading system Level 2 Distinction* - Level 1 Pass
College courses often have an entry requirement of 4 or 5 qualifications at grade 4 or higher, including English & Maths

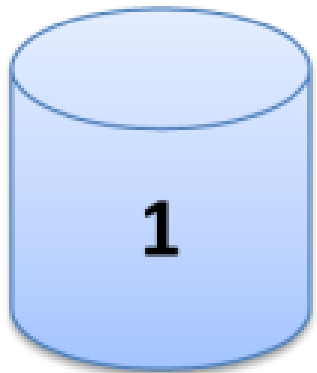


Guided Pathways

Pathway D	English, Maths, Science, History or Geography & 2 options

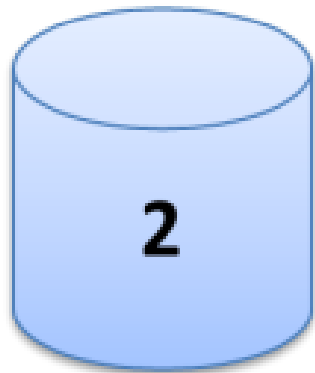

Advice for selecting your subjects

DO

- Look at which qualifications you need to apply to college or an apprenticeship
- Consider which courses you will need for a future career
- Think about how you prefer to be assessed – Exams, coursework, practical assessments
- Select subjects which you are interested in and will be motivated to work hard in
- Speak to lots of people about your options

DON'T

- Select a subject because your friend is selecting it
- Pick a subject because you think it is easy
- Choose a subject based on your current teacher
