Planning your ASK activities

Planning meeting

Your ASK delivery partner will organise a planning meeting with you (this can be in person or online). The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the learning aims for the workshop(s) based on the needs of students in the school or college. This will help you to select, prioritise and plan the most suitable and impactful workshops based on the needs of your students and how the programme can be best used to enhance your progressive and responsive approach to careers provision.

Maximising the offer

The ASK programme is a finite resource and as such, when designing your support, we will look to build upon your existing activities and prior knowledge. We may ask that you consider booking multiple ASK activities on one day to maximise the impact of each visit and that you complement the programme by utilising the resources and self-serve materials that the programme offers.

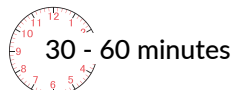
Awareness assembly

Introduce apprenticeships and T Levels to your students.

Delivery options:

- Face-to-face
- Virtual

Recommended delivery time:



Awareness assemblies are a great way to introduce apprenticeships and other post-16 and post-18 options to your students. They involve expert speakers visiting your school or college (in person or virtually) to present to groups of students and explain the range of career options.

The assemblies can be tailored to meet the needs of your students: whether that be focussing on sustainable Green Apprenticeships or differentiating for a SEND cohort. They provide an overview of the opportunities, the different sectors and levels available, including an introduction to higher and degree apprenticeships.

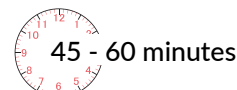
Register on FAA

Help students to register for Find an Apprenticeship (FAA).

Delivery options:

- Face-to-face
- Virtual

Recommended delivery time:



Registration workshops are interactive sessions designed to assist students in setting up their personal account on Find an Apprenticeship (FAA), the government online apprenticeship vacancy service. These sessions are best delivered in person, but can also be delivered virtually.

During the workshop, students will be shown how to:

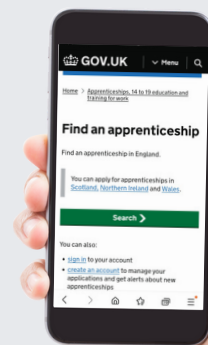
- Set up a GOV.UK One Login.
- Register on 'Find an apprenticeship'.

It is preferable that students are supported to register at school/college, or at home. Teachers and career advisers can also access a new guide created to support each step of the registration process. www.careersandenterprise.co.uk/the-ask-programme/



In order to participate in this session, students will require the following:

- A personal email address (not the school email address)
- Access to a computer, laptop or tablet or
- Access to a mobile phone with the ability to receive a text message or download an authentication app
- Internet access (wifi / data)



Search and apply

Support students to know where to search and how to apply for apprenticeships.

Delivery options:

- Face-to-face
- Virtual

Recommended delivery time:



60 minutes / full lesson

This workshop encourages students to understand the different ways that you can search for apprenticeship vacancies in a fun and interactive way. We will explore the new features and functions of the Find an Apprenticeship website, as well as looking at the different ways that employers may advertise their positions. We will also cover the different application processes that could be encountered in apprenticeship recruitment.

This workshop is best delivered in person, but can also be delivered as a live virtual session.

This workshop will include:

- The different ways that you can search for apprenticeship vacancies.
- How to use the search filters on Find an Apprenticeship.
- Managing applications on Find an Apprenticeship.
- Understanding application processes and what they could involve.
- Hints and tips for successful apprenticeship job applications.

In order to participate in this session, students will need to have set up their account on Find an Apprenticeship, including their GOV.UK One Login account. Please see page 8.

Mock assessment centre

Interactive group workshop introducing students to apprenticeship recruitment methods.

Delivery options:

- Face-to-face
- Virtual

Recommended delivery time:



60 minutes / full lesson

Assessment centres are increasingly being used by employers as part of their recruitment activities, particularly in large and competitive schemes.

This engaging workshop helps students to understand what to expect from an assessment centre and to participate in a mock activity that is similar to what they may experience in real life.

Workshops can be tailored to the students' level of ability, confidence and areas of interest.

This workshop is always popular with students!


This workshop will include:

- What is an assessment centre?
- Why do employers use them?
- What to expect if you are invited to an assessment centre.
- Hints and tips for participating in an assessment centre.
- What you can do to prepare in advance.
- Asking for feedback.
- Reflecting on what you would do differently at a future assessment centre.



Interview techniques

Support students to understand what to expect in an interview and how they can prepare.

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In any apprenticeship recruitment process, it is highly likely that it will involve an interview. This enjoyable workshop is designed to support students to understand what an interview is like and what they can do in advance to help them to prepare.

This workshop will include:

- Why employers use interviews.
- The different types of interview settings.
- The typical format and structure of interviews.
- The types of questions you may be asked.
- Ideas for questions that you could ask the employer.
- Hints and tips for how to prepare before an interview.
- How to make a great lasting impression.
- Post-interview follow-up ideas.

This workshop will be suitable for students who are actively applying for an apprenticeship, as well as students who have not yet decided on their next steps.



Careers fairs

Additional support at your next careers fair through the ASK programme.

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If you're hosting a careers fair for your students, you can access additional support through the ASK team. We can join you either in person or virtually to inform students and their parents or carers about apprenticeships and the benefits. We can also work with local employers and apprenticeship ambassadors to join the ASK team to share their experiences of apprenticeships and discuss any opportunities that might be coming up with their organisation.

Most schools and colleges ask that we deliver a short presentation about apprenticeships at the start or during their careers fair, but your ASK delivery partner will work with you to work out what works best for your school or college.

Careers fair resources

New for the 24/25 academic year, we will be introducing a resources bundle that schools can download or use digitally to support students during a careers fair to explore apprenticeships and technical education. It will include printable materials as well as links to useful films and activities that will support attendees to consider their future options.



Support for parents and carers

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The ASK programme delivery partners can join you either in person preferably, or virtually where required, at various parent and carer events. For example, we can attend your school or college's options evenings, transition planning events or any other parent or carer workshops to provide them with information on apprenticeships and the alternative pathway programmes, such as T Levels.

We also offer sessions delivered to parents and carers to support them in helping their child to navigate the apprenticeship recruitment process and how they can support them to prepare. 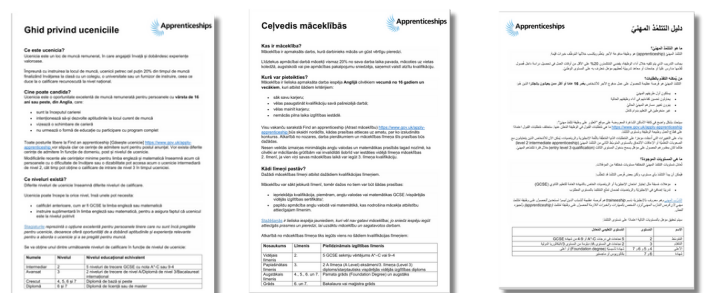

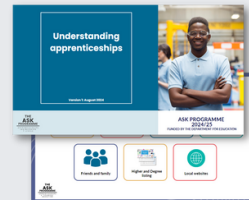
