Assessment week

<u>Year 11</u>

Monday 10th November will be the start of our whole school assessment week. Our Year 11 students will start their 2-week mock exam window on this day. With exams taking place in the sports hall or small room for students with access arrangements. All students have been issued with their individual exam timetable.

Key Stage 3

Tuesday 11th November will see the start of our 3-day KS3 (Years 7-9) BASE Assessment window. On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday students will complete 3 BASE assessments per day. Students will be given the opportunity to revise for these assessments prior to completing them. The assessments will be completed in tutor group classrooms. A small number of students may complete them in a smaller room with students from their year group. The table below shows what the day will look like for a Year 7 student.

Students in Year 8 and Year 9 will follow a similar timetable for the 3 days. The difference being the time they have their lunch break. The only normal timetabled lesson students will attend will be Period 4. To support students in managing their workload throughout this assessment week **the school day will finish at 2.30pm on these 3 days for all students Y7-11.** Students will leave the school site at 2.30pm. If a student needs to remain on site, the homework club will start at 2.30pm on these days. Students can remain at school in the homework club until the normal finish time of 3pm or stay as long as they wish until the homework club finishes at 4pm.

There will be a **pre-assessment week** for KS3 students. This will see students complete their Art, Music and Drama BASE assessments in their timetabled lessons for these subjects. The pre-assessment week will take place in the **week beginning 3**rd **November**.

BASE Assessments

Our staff have worked in collaboration with other staff from across FMAT to design assessments for most subjects in KS3 which assess the following areas:

- Previous knowledge
- Gap knowledge
- Current knowledge

Teachers input how a student has performed on each question using either B, A, S or E.

Each student then receives an overall grade for that assessment which would be an average of how they performed across all questions. For example, S – Secure. This would mean that the student is performing at the level we expect in relation to their KS2 data from Primary school & Baseline assessment data we have from when they joined Smith's Wood Academy.

Parent/Carer support

Parents and carers play a vital role in the assessment week. We ask that you complete the following actions to support your child in performing to the best of their ability during these assessments.

- Discuss the upcoming assessments with your child.
- Check your child has a revision timetable in place which covers all their subjects.
- Remind your child that little and often is the best method for revision when thinking about how long to spend revising.
- Provide an environment free from distractions for them to work whilst at home.
- Offer praise and encouragement. Your child will have strengths across different subjects. They should be ambitious and try their best in all subjects.
- Encourage your child to attend the homework club.

We will run a mop up timetable where students from Year 7-11 will complete any assessments they may have missed. This timetable will be shared with relevant students asap after the assessment week.
