YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

WEEK COMMENCING 6TH JULY 2026

We are delighted to confirm that Year 10 Work Experience will take place in person for five days during the week commencing Monday 6th July 2025. This is an exciting and enriching opportunity for our students to gain valuable first-hand experience of the world of work, develop essential employability skills, and begin to explore potential career pathways before making important decisions about their post-16 education and training options.

Taking part in work experience helps students connect their learning in school to real-life situations, giving them a clearer sense of how their subjects and skills apply in the workplace. It also encourages independence, maturity, and responsibility — qualities that will serve them well both in their studies and in future employment.

All students should now have brought home three key documents to support their work experience placement:

- Parent Letter – providing key information about the programme, including dates, expectations, and guidance for families on how to support their child.
- Employer Letter – outlining the expectations and responsibilities for students while on placement, as well as information for employers about safeguarding and supervision.
- Employer Pro-Forma – a form to be completed by the placement provider prior to the start of the work experience week, confirming essential details such as insurance, contact information, and a brief outline of the role.

To help families with the process, parents and carers will also receive an MCAS notification listing employers who are offering work experience placements this year. Copies of all forms and letters will be available through MCAS, allowing students to reprint or access replacements if any documents are misplaced. For those without access to a printer at home, Mrs Long will have spare copies available in the Careers Hub, along with additional advice and guidance for students still seeking placements.

- › I am a young carer
- › I have a disability or learning difficulty
- › I am in the care of my local authority
- › I receive Free School Meals / FSM6 / Pupil Premium
- › My parents or carers did not go to university

Creating the perfect study space

Finding a workspace at home

Not every family has a spare room or desk - and that's fine. The key is helping your teen find a spot that signals "work time" and limits distractions.

How you can help:

- Choose a consistent area, even if it's part of a dining table or kitchen counter.
- Make it feel different from leisure time - use a box or tray to store study items.
- Keep lighting good and background noise low; headphones can help if it's busy.
- Encourage them to tidy up when finished so the space returns to normal use.



Managing screen time

Laptops and phones are essential for studying, but they can also be the biggest distractions. Clear digital boundaries help your teen focus and protect their wellbeing.

How you can help:

- Encourage phones out of reach or on "Do Not Disturb" while revising.
- Use focus apps or timers to block social media during work sessions.
- Suggest checking messages only during planned breaks.
- Keep some activities (e.g. meals, movie time) deliberately phone-free.

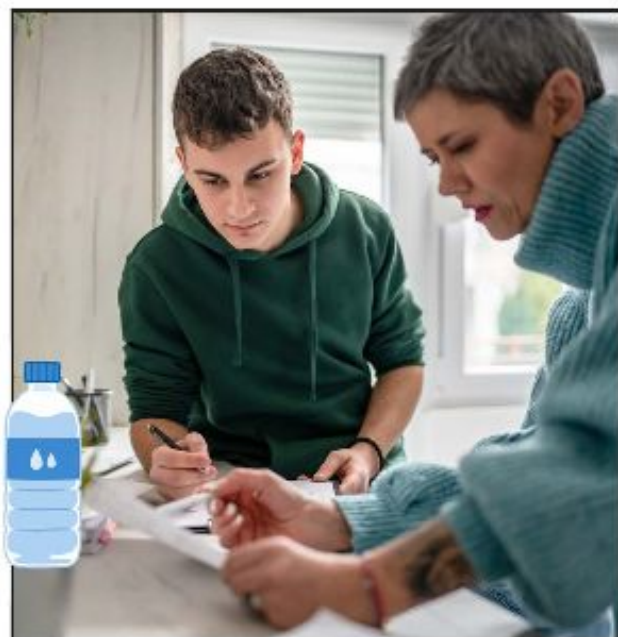


Setting the mood for concentration

The study environment shapes focus more than we think. Light, scent, sound and temperature can all make revision more effective - or more stressful.

How you can help:

- Keep the space bright and well ventilated; natural light boosts alertness.
- Use quiet background music or white noise if it helps them focus.
- Keep the temperature comfortable - too warm makes concentration drop.
- Try a subtle scent (like citrus or peppermint) to create a "study atmosphere."

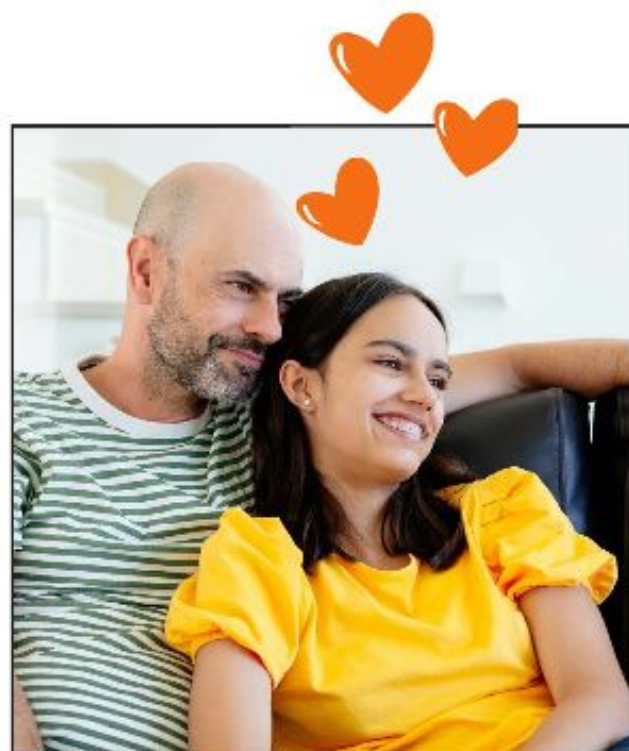


Keep the atmosphere positive

A calm, encouraging home environment makes a big difference. Your support helps your teen stay confident and motivated, especially when things feel stressful.

How you can help:

- Ask how you can help rather than assuming what they need.
- Keep your own tone calm - they'll often mirror your energy.
- Be patient if they're short-tempered - stress often comes out sideways.
- Plan small ways to relax together.

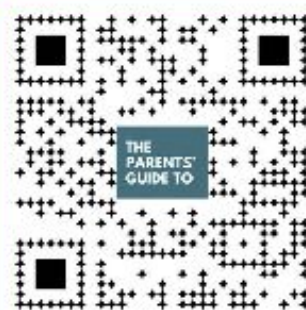

Once complete you will gain the opportunity for a 1-1 meeting with our careers advisor to discuss your next steps.



1. Students are required to complete 100 hours of volunteering by engaging in community service or relevant work experience.
2. Complete a mock interview: Students must participate in a simulated job interview to develop professional communication skills.

Once these requirements are met, students will gain eligibility to pursue the Level 2 qualification in their chosen career field.



1. Students are required to complete 200 hours of volunteer work.
2. On completion students must present their experiences to the board of governors.

Upon fulfilling this requirement, they will gain the opportunity to be mentored by a professional in their chosen career field.



1. Students are required to complete 500 hours of volunteer work.
2. Leadership Activity: After completing the volunteer hours, students must lead a school assembly.
3. Work Experience Opportunity: Students will be offered work experience placements relevant to their future career interests.
