

Dear Parents and Carers,

As many of you will be aware, England are playing in the early hours of Monday morning. We recognise that this is a significant event for many of our families, students and staff, and we hope everyone enjoys the occasion responsibly.

We would like to remind parents and carers that school will be open as normal on Monday, and we expect all students to attend and arrive on time.
